

Application Instructions for Responsive Classroom Program Development and Writing Fellowship

The application process is now open for the July 1, 2017–June 30, 2018 *Responsive Classroom* Program Development and Writing Fellowship.

This is a one year, full-time, salaried and benefited teacher-on-loan opportunity open only to *Responsive Classroom* consulting teachers. Fellows will learn the process for designing workshop products and for authoring or co-authoring a range of *Responsive Classroom* publications.

Please keep the following guidelines and requirements in mind as you prepare and submit your application:

- 1. This is a competitive process. While being a consulting teacher is the minimum eligibility criterion to be considered for the fellowship, it does not guarantee selection as a fellow.
- 2. Applicants selected for a final interview will be notified by February 17, 2017, and must be able to attend a mandatory Candidate Assessment Day on Saturday, March 4, 2017 in Turners Falls, MA.
- 3. There are four RC Fellows positions open (2 elementary and 2 middle school).

Application Process

 The deadline for application submission is Tuesday, January 31, 2017. The application and all supporting documents must be submitted through the online Center for Responsive Schools Application for Employment by 11:59 pm EST on this date. The application checklist is below:

 - Goals Statement should be uploaded in the Cover Letter section of the Center for Responsive Schools Online Application.
 - The Notification of Attempt to Apply Form and all three referral forms should be uploaded in the Cover Letter section of the Center for Responsive Schools Online Application.



Selection Process

- 1. Applicants selected for an interview must attend the Candidate Assessment Day on Saturday, March 4, 2017 in Turners Falls, MA.
- 2. These candidates will receive notification if they are selected as a 2017–2018 RC Program Development and Writing Fellow by March 6, 2017, with instructions for next steps.

- 1. As a *Responsive Classroom* Program Development and Writing Fellow, you may decide to apply for an educational leave of absence.

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Directions for Writing Your Goals Statement

Your Goals Statement should be a minimum of two and a maximum of four double-spaced typed pages. Your pages should have a 1-inch margin on all sides and be typed in 12-point Calibri font.

Your Goals Statement should be written in response to the following three questions:

- 1. As a potential program developer, what particular skills, experiences, or dispositions do you have that will support you in being successful in developing a portfolio of workshop products?
- 2. As an author or co-author of RC publications for elementary or middle school teachers or students, what would be ideal topics for books, articles, or other publications that you would be interested in writing about, and why?
- 3. Reflecting on the activities and expectations for a fellow, briefly describe what excites you the most and what capacity you are looking forward to developing.
