<p>Engage with curriculum content through:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Reading • Writing • Talking • Listening • Hands-on experiences • Reflection 	<p>Students are required to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Sit passively • Have knowledge poured into them by a content expert

Interactive learning structures:

- Increase interaction
- Often involve movement
- Have a variety of uses
- Require effective management

Benefits of using interactive learning structures:

- Generate interest in content
- Motivate students
- Meet students' developmental needs
- Provide opportunities for students to collaborate
- Reduce off-task behaviors
- Create positive community
- Help students develop A+SEL skills
