Language is one of our most powerful tools for supporting students

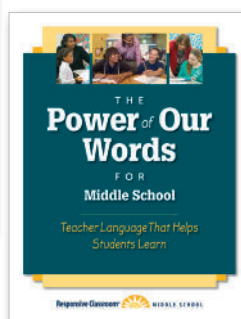
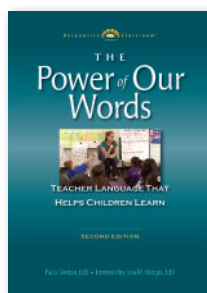
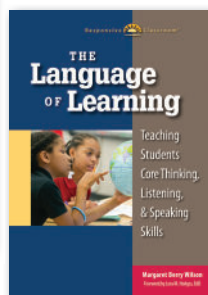
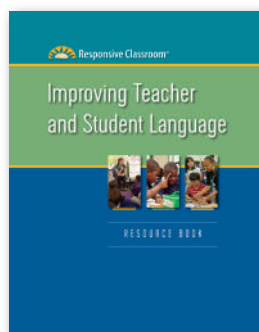
