

Elementary Core Course

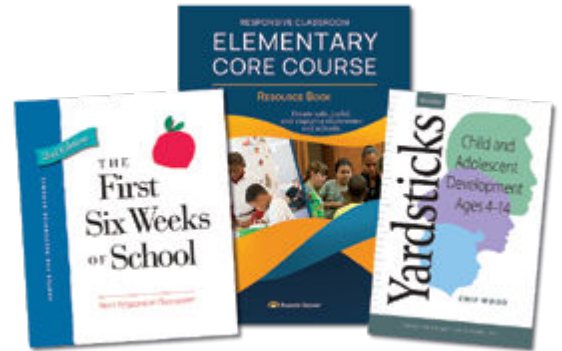
For educators of grades PreK–6
