## First Day of School Checklist: Elementary

Before Students Arrive		
	Review any available student data. Try the <u>Birthday Cluster Exercise</u> .  Learn and practice students' names.  Display a morning message that includes a welcome and a question or prompt.  Arrange the classroom furniture to support collaboration and accessibility.  Post the steps for the morning routine.	
	Prepare a visual daily schedule.	
	Plan a Morning Meeting and a closing circle.

	Building a Positive Community	
	Greet each student warmly at the door.	
	Introduce yourself with a personal story or a visual "about me" activity.	
	Lead a simple, low-risk Morning Meeting to model and teach this routine.	
	Learn and begin using student names immediately.	
	Play a name game or a cooperative activity for students to learn about each other.	
	Begin building class agreements by discussing hopes and dreams for the year.

Teaching Routines and Expectations		
	Introduce and model the signal for attention.	
	Teach, model, and practice key routines (lining up, sharpening pencils).	
	Explain how to use specific materials and spaces.	
	Introduce one or two classroom rules or expectations, with examples.	
	Use Interactive Modeling for key routines and tools (e.g., how to sit on the rug).

	Learning Time
	Include at least one short academic activity to set the tone for learning.  Keep activities simple, low-risk, engaging, and community-focused (read-alouds, math games, journal prompts).  Begin to informally assess students' comfort, participation, and strengths.

	Middle of the Day
	Explain and preview the routines and guidelines for recess and lunch.  Work with support staff to teach and model recess and lunch procedures by visiting the playground and cafeteria in the morning.  Prepare for quiet time, read aloud, or use another structure to allow for a smooth transition back into the classroom.

	End-of-the-Day Routine
	Practice packing up and dismissal procedures.  Hold a closing circle to reflect with students on the day (What did you enjoy?  What surprised you?).
